



Figure 3 Share of free countries in Europe compared with those in the rest of the world in 2022 (by number of countries)




Figure 4 Share of free countries in Europe compared with those in the rest of the world in 2022 (by population)




Figure 5 Share of free countries in Europe compared with those in the rest of the world in 2022 (by share of world GDP)






Figure 6 Europeans living in free, partly free, and not free countries in 2022

Figure 7 People living in free, partly free, and not free countries worldwide in 2022



Figure 8 How similar are your views with respect to the views of the EU? (Freedom)


Perceived similarity of views on 'freedom' between the EU and citizens of the following countries...

Figure 9 How similar are your views with respect to the views of the EU? (Democracy)


Perceived similarity of views on 'democracy' between the EU and citizens of the following countries...

Figure 10 Perception of media freedom in the EU from the outside


Perception of Media Freedom in the EU

Which of the following countries comes closest to having a real democracy?




Figure 12 Share of free countries in Europe, 1972-2021


Figure 13 Largest 10-year declines in Freedom House ratings in Europe

Largest 10-Year Declines of European Countries 2012-22







Figure 18 HFI country report 2022: United Kingdom




Figure 19 HFI country report 2022: Germany




Figure 20 HFI country report 2022: Ukraine

Figure 21 State of freedom in the EU in 2022 according to Freedom House





Figure 22 Importance of freedom of movement to Europeans

Nearly three quarters of Europeans agree that the EU would not be worth having without freedom of movement





Figure 23 State of press freedom in Europe






Figure 25 State of academic freedom in Europe in 2021 (0-1, low to high)


Figure 26 Number of people at risk of poverty or social exclusion in the EU


Figure 27 People at risk of poverty or social exclusion by EU member state
